Reading

We hope students will enjoy reading a variety of books this summer! To that end, we ask each rising fifth grader to read at least two novels or nonfiction works - from different genres. Please note titles, authors, and genres to share with us when school begins. This is a terrific opportunity to explore new types of literature! Librarian Mrs. Bryan-Diehl has cultivated a wonderful list of books for students. Families may use these suggestions or visit their local libraries.

In addition, students have an optional, but highly encouraged Reading and Writing Summer Bingo board posted on the St. Michael's website. Students who choose to complete these should bring bingo boards the first week of school.

Writing

Summer is a great time to keep a journal filled with activities, travels, fun, and personal thoughts. It's a terrific way to improve writing skills, develop voice, and practice grammar and punctuation skills.

Math

Fact fluency is necessary for higher-level computation and problem solving. Rising fifth grade students are expected to know the following to automaticity (within 3 seconds):

- addition and subtraction facts to 20
- multiplication facts through 12x12 and their related division facts

Students are strongly encouraged to review these facts throughout the summer. Additionally, rising fifth graders should complete the one-page math review posted on the St. Michael's website. This will be collected the first week of school.
